#### Horticulture

Staging horticulture innovatively;-petite horticulture; requirements for NGC Horticulture Top Exhibitor Awards and Section Awards; Review of Judging Qualities on point scoring form, commenting vocabulary and judging procedures. Discussion of growing and showing two Horticulture types with emphasis on exhibiting and judging; Practice point scoring.

Functional and Exhibition tables; role of balance, color and texture in table designs; creative staging of table designs; petite designs and requirements for Petite Award; requirements for Design section Top Exhibitor Award, Table Artistry Award; review of judging qualities found on the Design Point Scoring Form, commenting vocabulary and judging procedures; Instructor's six + designs illustrate: Functional Table; Exhibition Table 1) with completed floral design and 2) with additional material only; Table/Tray for one; and Petite Designs of different sizes.
