

94th ANNUAL THE GARDEN CLUB OF GEORGIA, INC. CONVENTION

The 94th Annual Convention of The Garden Club of Georgia, Inc. was held April 12-13, 2022 at the Marriott Macon City Center, Macon with 252 members and guests attending. The two-day "Gardening in Macon" convention was hosted by Oleander District.

On Tuesday afternoon April 12th, members were treated to two informative speakers. Bonnie Satterthwaite, The Espoma Company, spoke on "There was no Miracle Gro in the Garden of Eden" and Stan Gray, The Coastal Georgia Botanical Garden, presented a program on "When Iris Eyes are Smiling".

Tuesday evening included time to meet and greet our special guest National Garden Clubs, Inc. President Mary Warshauer. Tuesday evening, we celebrated and honored the outstanding work of our garden clubs and councils around the state at the Awards Banquet. Mary Warshauer, NGC President, joined GCG President Peggy Tucker on stage for Awards Presentations. 106 First place GCG awards were given and 42 Deep South Garden Clubs, Inc. awards were won by GCG. The coveted Garden Club of Georgia Trophy was presented to Spalding Garden Club, Dogwood District and Spalding Garden Club won Deep South Garden Clubs, Inc. Outstanding Club. Peachtree Garden Club Medal was presented to Vicki Jones member of Magnolia Garden Club, Laurel District. GCG Member Award of Honor was presented to Lee Dunn member of Spalding Garden Club, Dogwood District.

Wednesday morning, April 13th started off with Peggy Tucker, GCG President, presiding over the annual business meeting. Lester Miller, Macon-Bibb Mayor, gave a warm welcome to everyone. A warm welcome was given by members when NGC President Mary Warshauer was introduced.

The convention concluded with the Member Celebration Luncheon. Laura Martin was featured speaker and talked about "Taming the Natives: Celebrating North American Wildflowers". New Life Members were recognized during the luncheon for 2019-2022: 53 new GCG Life Members, 10 new Deep South Life Members and 9 new National Life Members.
