



## GARDEN THERAPY Good News!!! The Garden Therapy Grant is now \$750.

The Garden Therapy Program has provided funds to clients for gardening activities to promotes the therapeutic aspects of gardening. The Garden Club Georgia is expanding this program and asking clubs to become more actively involved with Garden Therapy Projects at many local hospitals, nursing homes and senior centers. We encourage single garden club, a group of garden clubs, a council or a district to sponsor and fund a project with their own funds or other resources then apply to GCG for a **Garden Therapy Grant of \$750** to assist with this project.

Garden Therapy Grant Application.

This Garden Therapy Project must be a hands-on project and clients at the hospital, nursing home or senior center must be actively involved in the therapy activity. The Garden Club Members do not have to participate physically and it is okay for the facility staff to lead the activity, but the garden club or club (s) need to provide over site, monitor the finances, and insure the project is completed as planned.

#### **Blue Star Markers and Gold Star Family Markers**

The Blue Star Memorial (BSM) Program honors service men and women who have served, are serving or will be serving in the armed services of the United States. Memorial Markers and By-Way Markers are placed at locations such as national cemeteries, parks, veteran's facilities and gardens. The Blue Star Memorial Marker Program was established in 1944 at the end of World War II and honors all who serve in the US Armed Forces; past, present, and future.

In 2015, the Gold Star Families Marker was incorporated into the National Garden Clubs Blue Star Memorial Marker Program. The Gold Star Families Marker honors the families of U.S. Armed Forces members who died in battle or in support of certain military activities.

The Garden Club of Georgia, Inc. has been very supportive of this program. They are offering a grant to seven districts and member clubs/councils for the restoration of Blue Star Markers. #### **GARDEN TIPS AND TRICKS:**

**Hydrangeas** are a beautiful addition to any garden, and with these simple steps, you can grow and care for them easily:

#### **Growing Conditions:**

- 1. Choose the right plant.
- 2. Hydrangeas like sunlight in the morning and shade in the afternoon.
- 3. Plant Hydrangeas at the right depth in the ground & give them enough room to grow and stay healthy.
- 4. Hydrangeas like to be constantly moist so water them regularly, but sitting in too much water can cause root rot. Hydrangeas have shallow roots and keeping them hydrated is key. Don't let them get stressed!
- 5. Plant in well-draining, fertile soil with compost or organic matter. Make sure to mulch heavily around the bottom.
- 6. Prune to keep them healthy. Get rid of old or sick branches, but be careful not to cut too much, especially those kind that produce flowers on old wood.
- 7. Provide winter protection with mulch and burlap wrapping if needed. Especially after the plant has produced its new buds.
- 8. Controlling the color: Adding lime to make the soil a bit sweeter will bring a **pink** color and adding acid will produce a **blue** color.
- 9. Disease and Pest Prevention: Start by picking the right spot, keep it hydrated in good rich, well drained soil, with space to grow and breathe. Water from the bottom and not on the leaves. Mulch around the bottom and prune off all sick or dead parts with clean tools.
- 10. With these tips, you can enjoy the beauty of Hydrangeas in your garden year after year!!

#### SPRINKLE COFFEE GROUNDS IN YOUR SOIL

The taste and smell maybe pleasing to many, but not to squirrels. Coffee is a natural repellant for squirrels. Instead of discarding your coffee grounds, sprinkle them around the surface soil and in your potted plants.

Coffee grounds are also good fertilizers for plants. They provide Nitrogen and Potassium to promote healthy plants while repelling those squirrels.
