## DEADLINES FOR MOST APPLICATIONS:

### NOVEMBER 15<sup>TH</sup>

---

1. Awards Year is January 1 – December 31 annually for all submissions, including projects. If a continuing project, application must be based on work accomplished during the current awards year. (Note: This calendar year may not coincide with your club's fiscal year. Exceptions are noted on individual awards). An exception is the YEARBOOK Award #16.... On the application, check the number of members listed in the yearbook and include that number on the application.
2. On the application line for name of club, list the **name of the club** followed by the **City of the club**. Example: Magnolia Garden Club Brunswick, GA  
\*Type club name exactly as you wish it on the certificate.
3. Only individuals, garden clubs, garden sections of other clubs in Georgia, and garden club councils or districts that are members in good standing of GCG are eligible for awards competition. EXCEPTION: individual members, clubs, councils, or Districts may NOT apply for awards for their work associated with a state project, including, but not limited to: Historic House and Garden Pilgrimage, Workshops, Conventions, and Symposia. Junior, Intermediate, and High School Garden Clubs must be sponsored by an adult club and must observe the same award rules as adult members to be eligible for any award.
4. **The 2025-2027 GCG Application form must be downloaded from the GCG website and submitted with award application documentation electronically (email) to [awardschairmangcga@gmail.com](mailto:awardschairmangcga@gmail.com)**  
**(If possible, send flower show book of evidence by email.**  
**Printed applications – See Exceptions below. Send to GCG Awards, 129 Hannah Drive, Jesup, GA 31546.**
5. EXCEPTIONS: - Flower Show Books of Evidence (if not sent electronically), Flower Show Schedules, Publications, Yearbooks – Send a printed copy of the application form and printed documents. For any submission made by mail or delivery, DO NOT request a receipt

signature as this may delay receipt. Tracking numbers may be used.

6. To compete for a Flower Show Award, a show must have been evaluated. The show must be a Standard Show and must have scored 95 points or more to be eligible. Shows are scored in accordance with NGC guidelines and evaluation forms.
7. **Deadlines are on pages 13-17 in the State Awards Summary Chart. ALL electronic award entries must be sent to the GCG Awards email address on or before deadline. NO EXCEPTIONS! The printed award applications must be in the hands of the GCG Awards Chairman on or before the deadline. No exceptions. – send early.**
8. Applications will not be returned.
9. The General Scoring Rubric will be used for scoring unless otherwise indicated in award description.
10. All results of judging committees are subject to review by the State Awards Committee. Awards in any category may be withheld if entries are not found to be meritorious. If an entry more nearly complies with another award, the Awards Committee reserves the right to transfer the entry. Awards may be subdivided.
11. Packets with Award Certificates will be available for a club/council/district representative to pick up at end of the Awards Ceremony at the next GCG Convention. Any packets not claimed will be sent to the club/council/district.
12. **Perpetual trophies are on display at State Headquarters in Athens.** A State Certificate will be given for the awards and an entry made in the permanent Awards Book at Headquarters. DSGC and NGC awards/certificates won by Georgia garden clubs or councils will be disbursed at the discretion of the State President.
13. Award size groups have been reclassified as follows:

**Categories by Size: Garden Club applications shall be judged according to size determined by number of members for whom GCG dues are paid including Active, Associate, Inactive, Honorary, State, Life, etc. (These are the dues paid by March 1<sup>st</sup> not to include subscribing members)**

**Small club 1 – 20 members  
Medium club 21 – 50 members  
Large club 51+ members**

14. **Do not use** the same exact application for several awards. Clubs can use the same project but change the information to reflect each award.
15. **Club or council number** is critical! Be sure to include it on the award application. A list of clubs and councils with GCG numbers is found on the GCG Website.
16. For General Awards, the application should include: Award Application Form **plus** up to 3 additional single-sided pages.

3. Smokey Bear posters must include Smokey's fire prevention message **"Only You Can Prevent Wildfires."**
4. Woodsy Owl posters must include Woody's conservation message: **"Lend a Hand Care for the Land!"**
5. Each poster MUST be 11 x 17 inches in size.
6. The posters should encourage children to take a personal role in preventing wildfires or conserving natural resources.
7. A good poster has a bold and simple design. Its message is easily read and understood and is delivered both in picture and in text.
8. Materials that can be used: crayons, markers, poster paints, watercolors, etc. The choice of the paper is up to the child.
9. Posters may include artwork pasted upon a second piece of paper; however, they must be flat. No 3-dimensional posters, computer scanned, or electronically generated images will be accepted.
10. The artist's name, address, home phone, grade, school, teacher's name, city, and state must be printed on the back of the poster in the lower right corner. Please print the label from GCG website, then cut, paste, or tape to the back of each child's poster.
11. Each poster must also show the name and city of the sponsoring local garden club.
12. Posters are to be completed by individual student artist.
13. Students should check spelling. Posters with spelling errors will be disqualified.
14. Posters will be judged for originality, design, slogan, artwork, and overall effectiveness of the message.
15. Since Smokey Bear and Woodsy Owl are official icons protected by law, the colors of their clothing must be accurate. See the colors on the at [www.fs.usda.gov/conservationeducation](http://www.fs.usda.gov/conservationeducation). A poster may include just the head of Smokey or Woodsy.
16. Winning posters should be copied as they will not be returned.
17. Visit [www.gardenclub.uga.edu](http://www.gardenclub.uga.edu) and [www.gardenclub.org](http://www.gardenclub.org) for more contest details.
18. Only 5 first place posters in the state competition will be entered in regional competition. Regional winners will be entered in national competition. National entries become the property of NGC.

Comments are written on a special form supplied by the show chairman and immediately mailed by the judge to State Flower Show Awards Chairman (Forms available from District Flower Show Evaluating Chairman).

- A. Fewer than 21 members (One (1) educational exhibit required (more educational exhibits permitted)).
- B. 21-49 members - One (1) educational exhibit, **and** at least one (1) additional educational exhibit, Botanical Arts Division, or Youth/Sponsored Group required.
- C. 50-99 members - One (1) educational exhibit, **and** at least two (2) additional educational exhibits, Botanical Arts Division, or Youth/Sponsored Group Division required.
- D. Group of member clubs that do not fit in categories A, B and C.

#### Award # 30                      District Standard Flower Show Award

Note: Although there is no NGC Award in this Category C, the GCG Awards chairman may forward to NGC using an existing appropriate category. A silver perpetual trophy given by Mrs. Charles O. Smith, Jr., (Deen Day Sanders) State President 1987-1989, may be awarded for the best Standard Flower Show sponsored by a District. Based on total number of member clubs within the District, a minimum of 75% must participate in the show. *Award not eligible for NGC Award No. 30.*

Districts, Councils of Garden Clubs and Judges Council are not eligible for this award.

## Award # 36      Educational Exhibit Achievement Award

A silver perpetual trophy given by the Imagination, Study Club, Atlanta, may be awarded for the best Educational Exhibit at a Standard Flower Show staged by a garden club, group of garden clubs, garden club council or an affiliate plant society.

A State Certificate may be awarded to the first-place winners in each of the following categories.
