Congratulations to all Club, Council, District and Individual Award Winners from The Garden Club of Georgia, Inc.!

The 2025 Awards, honoring projects from 2024, were announced at the 2025 GCG Convention in Augusta in April. This year, the Awards Committee worked diligently reviewing the 351 applications received for awards #1 through #H-3. The committee was pleased to award 280 winners across 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honorable Mention categories.

Fifty-three applications were sent for Deep South Award consideration, and GCG received thirty-eight winners, including 17 for 1st place, including Edna McClellan for Member of the Year and the Award for Most Deep South Life Memberships. Forty-five applications were sent for NGC Award consideration, for which GCG received 14 Overall Winners and Flower Show Rosettes, and 9 Runners-up awards.

In the Youth Contests, GCG recognized 100 winning entries from the over 1,500 Poetry, Poster, and Sculpture entries. GCG presented certificates and checks to 29 Poster, 59 Poetry, and 12 Sculpture winners. Deep South Youth Contests recognized GCG with 31 winners in Poetry, Sculpture, and Posters. National Garden Clubs awarded GCG Youth Contest entries with 15 Poetry winners and one poster winner.

The Awards Committee and all of GCG are very proud of the work our members accomplish. This year, we showed the entire country how Georgia promotes Beautification, Education, and Conservation. President Lisa Hall was kept very busy at the Deep South and NGC Conventions, accepting all our awards.

Roswell Garden Club; Medium and Large Club Winner Dogwood District

Founded in 1951, the Roswell Garden Club (RGC) is a vibrant community of 35 members dedicated to gardening, conservation, and community service. The club keeps members connected and informed through its printed newsletter, The Dirt, a comprehensive Yearbook, and a growing presence on Facebook, where it shares important updates, links, and gardening resources. Visitors and prospective members are warmly welcomed by a dedicated Visitor/New Member Chairman who helps introduce them to RGC's many opportunities and programs.

Each month, RGC hosts educational meetings featuring expert guest speakers on topics such as pollinators, vertical gardening, deer management, and the importance of preserving Georgia's natural habitats. In addition, a club member presents a short "Horticulture Lesson" at each meeting, providing useful and seasonal gardening tips.

Community involvement is central to RGC's mission. Members

Winchester Garden Club: Small Club Winner Magnolia District

Founded in 1959, the Winchester Garden Club (WGC) has established a long-standing tradition of community involvement, and leadership within the Columbus area. With a dedicated membership of ten active members, the club exemplifies a passion for civic engagement.

WGC members have been prominent representatives at district meetings and GCG and NGC Conventions. Their active participation extends beyond attendance; members serve on various influential boards, including the Columbus Council of Garden Clubs Inc., the Magnolia District Board, the GCG State Board, and the GCG Executive Board.

The Winchester Garden Club also plays an integral role in supporting broader programs within the GCG community. Its members are represented on the GCG 100th Birthday Celebration committee, participated as delegates at conventions, and served on several GCG committees. Their engagement is further demonstrated through participation in district meetings, fundraising events like the Historic Landscape Preservation Fundraiser, and the Magnolia District Flower Show. They have attended the Rosalynn Carter Butterfly Symposium and the celebration of the 75th Anniversary of the Camellia Garden Club..

Beyond their organizational commitments, WGC members are dedicated to serving their local community. They have gifted Tea Cup Fairy Gardens to a local nursing home, provided craft and school supplies to at-risk young girls at the Anne Elizabeth Shepherd Home, and donated blankets and winter gear to the Valley Rescue Mission for the homeless. Their participation in the Wreaths Across America program and their creative contributions at the Camellia and Magnolia Flower Show highlight their ongoing service and artistic expression. In addition, they presented GCG Greetings at the Gold Star Marker dedication in Reynolds, Georgia, and achieved recognition by winning 2nd place in the City of Columbus BOOtanical Scarecrow contest.

Meeting programs have covered a wide array of topics, including "Pollinators: The Good, the Bad and the Honey," "Ginkgo Trees: Living Fossils," and a demonstration on "Methods of Pressing Flowers." They have also offered practical advice on growing dahlias, a presentation entitled "Visit a Garden in Georgia", and demonstrated how to use edible flowers in culinary applications.

In addition to their community and educational endeavors, WGC members have actively shared their achievements and initiatives through articles featured in the Magnolia Messenger and Garden Gateways.

In summary, the Winchester Garden Club exemplifies a dedicated group of community servants whose influence extends through leadership, volunteerism, education, and environmental stewardship. Their ongoing efforts continue to enrich their community and promote a deep appreciation for the beauty and importance of plants and gardening.

MEMBER OF HONOR - EDNA MCCLELLAN

Edna McClellan, the recipient of the Member of Honor Award, has been an unwavering force within the Garden Club of Ellijay, the Laurel District, and The Garden Club of Georgia, Inc. For over 17 years, she has demonstrated consistent, selfless leadership and has served as a guiding figure to members across all levels of the organization.

Since joining the Garden Club of Ellijay in 2007, Edna has taken on numerous key roles within the club, including Treasurer, Vice President, and President (2011–2012). Even while managing her own successful medical billing business until her retirement in 2013, she actively dedicated her time and energy to advancing club initiatives and mentoring fellow members. She was particularly instrumental in the development of the club's youth program, which remains one of its most successful and celebrated endeavors.

A hallmark of Edna's service has been her passion for education and mentorship, particularly in the field of flower show design. She became an accredited Flower Show Judge in 2014 and achieved Master Judge status in 2023.



Through her leadership and teaching abilities, she has played a critical role in helping others grow in their understanding of floral design. Most notably, she has mentored three Garden Club of Ellijay members who, under her guidance, became accredited Flower Show Judges in 2024.

Her reach extends far beyond her local club. Within the Laurel District, Edna has served as Recording Secretary, Treasurer (2019–2021), and District Director (2015–2017), as well as holding various chairmanships over the years. She continues to serve the district today as an Adviser to the Director and Parliamentarian. Her ability to step up during times of need was most evident in 2023, when she seamlessly filled in as leader at the annual district meeting in the absence of both the Director and Co-Director.

At the state level, Edna has contributed significantly to the Garden Club of Georgia. She has served as Chairman of Basic Design, organizing and executing design classes across the state, and has also held the position of State Treasurer. Her commitment to the educational mission of the organization is evident in her efforts to enlist qualified instructors for classes and support the development of new leaders within the club community. She has also completed the **National Garden Clubs, Inc. Gardening School Course**, further enhancing her horticultural expertise and ability to contribute at all levels of the organization.

Edna is also an active member of the Creative Study Group and the North Georgia Council of Flower Show Judges, where she played a key role in sponsoring the Judges School in Marietta (2022–2024). For her dedication to this effort, she received an award from the Council. Her involvement in multiple organizations showcases the breadth of her influence and her tireless commitment to excellence in gardening, education, and leadership.

Originally from Southern California, Edna first developed an interest in gardening in 1974 while living in Pensacola, Florida. After moving around and eventually settling in Ellijay, she reconnected with that passion through the Garden Club of Ellijay, and has since become one of its most important and respected leaders. Recognition with the Member of Honor Award is a reflection of her extraordinary service, leadership, and unwavering dedication to the gardening community across Georgia.

AWARD OF MERIT NON-MEMBERS

THE DAVE SCOTT BIRD TRAIL PROGRAM ON SKIDAWAY ISLAND

Bluebird populations across the United States faced a severe decline by the 1970s, with fears of possible extinction due to habitat loss, especially the loss of native trees with cavities essential for nesting. In response, citizen scientists and bird enthusiasts began educating the public and encouraging participation in conservation efforts. One major strategy was the creation of monitored birdhouse "trails"; networks of safe nesting boxes that helped restore bluebird populations by providing secure places for nesting and raising young.

Inspired by such success stories, Skidaway Island resident Dave Scott, while visiting a golf course in Arkansas in the late 1990s, noticed bluebird boxes being used as 100-yard markers. Motivated by this idea, he took the initiative to install similar birdhouses on the golf courses of Skidaway Island. Although the local golf club initially did not support his enthusiasm, Scott persisted, crafting birdhouses on his own and placing them at each hole of one course. The project quickly gained popularity among residents and golfers, leading to the installation of birdhouses at all six golf courses on the island.

Dave Scott's passion and determination, supported by decades of work from dedicated individuals and strong community backing, resulted in flourishing populations of bluebirds and other songbirds on Skidaway Island. In 1997, the birdhouse trail was formally incorporated into Skidaway Audubon Society's initiatives, and following Scott's passing, his

friend Chuck Owen took over the program. In 2001, the project was officially named the Dave Scott Bird Trail Program (DSBT).

Since its inception, the program has grown from 15 birdhouses to over 240 as of spring 2024, lining golf courses and other parts of the island. This makes the Dave Scott Bird Trail one of the largest monitored birdhouse trails in the Southeastern United States. Over the first 20 years, the trail has helped more than 15,000 fledglings from species including bluebirds, chickadees, nuthatches, and titmice successfully leave their nests.

The program relies heavily on a dedicated team of thoroughly training volunteers who carefully observe nesting materials to identify the species nesting in each box, record data such as the number of eggs, nestlings, and fledglings, and ensure the boxes are properly maintained. Monitoring is a significant community effort involving residents of all ages, many coming from various island clubs and organizations. In addition to hands-on conservation work, the Dave Scott

Bird Trail program engages in community education and outreach. Information is widely shared through the Skidaway Audubon's website, email communications, pamphlets on proper birdhouse installation, and presentations at schools and local events. The program has also published Songbird Village – Volume 1, an educational book authored by Sarah Lucas and Brenda Ecken. Notably, the Dave Scott Bird Trail is the first bird trail in Georgia to become a member of the North American Bluebird Society (NABS). After more than 20 years, the Dave Scott Bird Trail continues to grow and thrive, with strong community involvement ensuring that Skidaway Island residents and visitors can enjoy the presence of bluebirds and many other songbirds for generations to come. The trail stands as a testament to how individual passion, community effort, and citizen science can combine to protect and celebrate local wildlife.

SEAL OF HONOR

REBECCA (BECK) HUNT GRIFFIN



For more than thirty years, Becky has been a passionate leader in pollinator conservation, environmental education, and community outreach, inspiring thousands to become active stewards of nature.

As Community and School Garden Coordinator for the University of Georgia's (UGA) Center for Urban Agriculture, Becky works with learners of all ages. Her true calling, however, lies in pollinator protection. In 2017, she launched the pilot for the "Great Georgia Pollinator Census", modeled after a Cornell University initiative. What began with 36 gardens now engages nearly 19,000 citizen scientists across the Southeastern U.S. This remarkable growth is a direct result of Becky's exceptional ability to build partnerships and connect people with purpose. The program now serves as a cornerstone initiative for the Garden Club of Georgia's conservation and education mission.

Becky's devotion also extends to seed-saving efforts, firefly conservation, and public engagement. A Georgia native, she grew up in Powder Springs with a childhood spent outdoors. A library book about

bees sparked a lifelong fascination that led her to earn a biology degree from Kennesaw State and later a master's in plant protection and pest management from UGA.

Her success is rooted in her collaborative spirit. Becky has brought together 33 project partners, including the Atlanta History Center, Callaway Gardens, Georgia Farm Bureau, Georgia Native Plant Society, Monarchs Across Georgia, and The Garden Club of Georgia. She also works with state agencies like the Georgia DepartmentS of Agriculture, Public Health, and Natural Resources, and partners with universities from Michigan to Florida.

A gifted speaker, Becky has presented to audiences ranging from schoolchildren and master gardeners to civic organizations and government groups. In just the past two years, she has delivered 89 programs—78 in Georgia, 10 out-of-state, and one internationally—reaching nearly 4,800 people. Her work has been featured in *Southern Living*, *Georgia Magazine*, the *Atlanta Journal-Constitution*, and the *Farmers and Consumers Market Bulletin*, and her *Pollinator Census e-newsletter* reaches over 6,000 subscribers**.

Becky Hunt Griffin is more than a conservationist—she is an educator, connector, and catalyst for change. Her efforts have made pollinator preservation accessible and actionable for citizens of all ages. Her leadership exemplifies the mission and values of the Garden Club of Georgia.


