




The Purpose of the Garden Club of Georgia

NAVIGATING THE GCG WEBSITE


Finding the website

If you have not been on the website yet, the first task is to be aware of its existence and then being able to find it. The address for the website is: https://www.gardenclubofgeorgia.org.

Home page and Main Menu

The first page that you will visit is the Home page. This is a welcome page and includes the latest information. As of this writing you will find an introduction to the new Social Media pages, the most current Awards booklet, Publication information, some education information and a calendar in list form of some of the upcoming events across the state. This page is changing all the time so be sure to check back to the Home page periodically.

At the top of the page, you will find the Main Menu.





I have included the sub menu under - About Us. If you are a new member or are just curious about what is there, you can check out the information found here. It is a good background of the organization including a welcome from the current president. Most of the information in the section will not change often, the history will be updated when we change presidents as will the president's welcome. You probably will not visit here often.

The Events Calendar is just like it sounds, a calendar of events around the state. If your club is sponsoring an event that you would like to have the public and other garden club members attend, send your information to your District Director and she can forward it on the be added to the calendar. Check this often, especially when scheduling an event that may collide with State or District events. News is stories sent in by clubs about things that they have done or may be doing. We would love to have your information to share on Social Media and in our News section. Send your stories and photos to GCGSocialMediaStars@gmail.com to be included.

Member 365 Portal is a direct link to our Member365 login screen. All club presidents and treasurers should have access to Member365 to keep their club rosters updated. If you have any questions when trying to use Member365 (presidents and treasurers only), contact our Office Manager Arianne Knowlton at GCG Headquarters. Her email is gcguga@gmail.com.

Contact is for general questions about GCG or for the public interested in joining a garden club. There are forms to fill out that will be sent to us for reply. Emails are rerouted to the appropriate people. You should not have to use this often as you will have more direct ways to reach the people who can answer your questions.


Menus to know

Three of the menus' entries were not mentioned above. They will be the ones you will use the most and they all have submenus to help navigate.



The Dogwood District symbol, District Director and a map of the district are the first things you will see on the page.





Member Resources- contains access to all information that pertains to the Garden Club of Georgia members. This is a very useful section to familiarize yourself with and to visit often.



Be sure to explore the items on this list. We will discuss several of them here.

Awards – The 2025-2027 Awards booklet can be found here along with the award application form and some samples. Visit here to apply for your awards.

Continuing Education – Did you know that you can get continuing education in Landscape Design, Gardening School and Environmental school. You can also train to be a Flower Show judge. All that information can be found here.

Finance and Admin Forms – This is where you will find forms that will help you run your club. The link to the President's report will be here when ready and forms for making donations to GCG are also located here.



GCG Personnel Guide – This section is the only one that requires a PASSWORD. If you do not have the password, check with your club president or your district director. We do not publish this password so that we can keep that personal information for just our members. You can get contact information for all state board members and district board members.

Leadership Training – Did you miss the Leadership and Awards Workshop this summer? It is offered every other year in the odd years. Since the information presented is very useful, it has been recorded and presented here. You can find just the section that may be useful to you. You will also find copies of the information attendees received at the meeting here.

Publications – This is the place to find a PDF version of the Garden Gateways if you like to read it electronically. There are also some great Landscape Design articles and many other publications that you may find interesting.

Membership – Want to add a subscribing member to your club? Do you know a group that would like to form a new garden club? This is the place to find that information.

GEORGIA BULB LASAGNE PLAN USING FLOWER POWER AND COLOR BLEND

With fall upon us, it's time to start thinking about bulbs. And with our Dogwood District bulb fundraiser underway, it's also a great opportunity to purchase bulbs that will both enhance your garden and containers and support our district. Here's a Georgia-friendly bulb lasagne plan. Lasagne is the plural of lasagna, and a fitting name for this planting method, which layers bulbs to make the most of small spaces and extend your bloom season. The result is a dense, colorful arrangement in a single container or bed. The plan uses bulbs that thrive in our winters and complement each other beautifully. It's designed for USDA zone 7 to 8, making it ideal for most of Georgia.

In choosing your bulbs from Flower Power, you need to consider a three-layer approach where your bottom layer will be your late bloomers (such as tulips, alliums, or fritillaries). Your middle layer will be mid-spring bloomers (such as hyacinths, daffodils or smaller alliums). Your top layer will be your earliest bloomers (such as crocuses, grape hyacinths, or snowdrops). Your container or your bed depth must be at least 14 inches, but if you're going to include the early bloomers amaryllis and paperwhites through Color Blends, then plant to a depth of 18 inches.

Next is the layering process-first add drainage material, pot feet or gravel to prevent rotting, and then fill with soil to the first layer's planting depth, placing bulbs pointy side up. Cover with more soil and repeat each layer of offsetting bulbs so they're not directly above each other.

Your finishing touch is to top with soil, water well and add a layer of mulch. If you're working with a container, you can plant winter pansies, violas or heucheras on top for immediate color until your bulbs emerge. (See visual reference on page 18.)





We are truly grateful so many members of other Garden Club of Georgia clubs were able to attend and enjoy Cherokee Garden Club's third biennial Cherokee Garden Tour on April 16th. The Tour featured five beautiful gardens in Atlanta's Buckhead community designed by landscape architects such as John Howard, Alex Smith and Bill Smith.

All proceeds from Tour sponsorships benefit the Cherokee Garden Club Community Fund, founded in 2008. Proceeds from the 2019 and 2023 Tours allowed the Fund to award an additional \$125,000 to local organizations. The projects supported by these grants included funding a trip to the Atlanta Botanical Garden for homeless children from the Boyce Ansley School, plantings at Atlanta Memorial Park, critical tree care following a record freeze at historic Oakland Cemetery, and providing supplies for a horticultural therapy program at Skyland Trail.
