They saw evidence in the museum of prehistoric animals and Native Americans that once inhabited the area, encountered alligators, turtles, mullet jumping out of the water, many birds, including a beautiful white egret, and even a couple of manatees. They also saw bald cypress trees, along with many flowers and butterflies along the riverbank, which they photographed and later identified. Wakulla Springs has also been the backdrop of several movies, including "The Creature from the Black Lagoon," (top photo). This fun day ended with a delicious lunch in the historic 1930s style Wakulla Springs Lodge!

 Add a pinch of garlic and onion powder on top

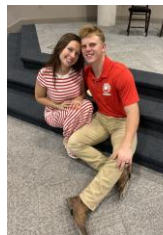
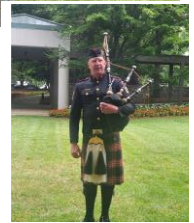
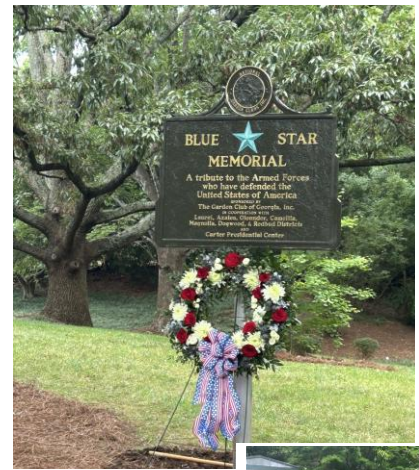
Place in order, on low, in crockpot, all above items. 3 + hrs, stir well, serve with tortilla chips or bread pieces. ENJOY!

After an introduction by Sherin Hinnant, the program featured American Legion Post 172, who proudly conducted the Presentation of Colors to honor the nation and its veterans. Greenbriar member, Jo Robbins, shared a reflection on "Faith and Freedom," followed by David Washington's vivid stories about "Georgia's Signers" of the Declaration of Independence. As the celebration concluded, The Rockin' Robins singers led the audience in singing, "My Country Tis of Thee" and "God Bless America," before guests departed to the "Armed Forces Medley," performed by the Heartland Flute Ensemble, a spirited farewell honoring America's enduring spirit. Okefenokee Gains UNESCO World Heritage Site Status

Fantastic News!!!! – After more than 4 decades in the making, and after 2 years since being officially nominated, the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site on Saturday, July 25, 2026 by the World Heritage Committee at its 48th annual session in Busan, South Korea.

- This is the FIRST World Heritage Site in Georgia
- This is the 27th site in the United States (other natural sites include: Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, and Yosemite National Parks)
- This is the 1st site to be managed by the National Wildlife Refuge System

This newly achieved status is well-deserved and serves as an acknowledgment of the swamp's world-class ecosystems... The Okefenokee is North America's largest blackwater swamp. It provides habitat to more than 1,270 species of plants and animals. Most of the swamp's wilderness is the same as it was 6000 years ago, making it one of largest intact wetland complexes left on Earth.

10 Fun Fall Things to Do!

Enjoy a new fall coffee flavor with a friend: Have a mid-afternoon bonfire and make s'mores

Take a walk in a wooded area that is dropping leaves: Try a fall dessert you never tried before

Sit on the front or back porch and listen: Find an apple picking orchard, and pick away

Go to an early movie and splurge on popcorn: Take lunch to someone who does not get out

Invite a friend over for lunch: Visit a pumpkin patch, buy one, and take a hayride

It comes on as a thought, back in my mind, the house seems more quiet, as I lose track of the time. The light and the shadows, they were not there before, the leaves on the driveway, they speak so much more. The mornings are cooler, there's dew on the leaves, a single bloom pops her head, challenging that breeze. Her potmates have turned, brown, black and dry, already giving in, to the altering sky. We know it is changing, the air, light, and days, preparing themselves, for a future display. Plain and simple, it may seem summer flees, yet I still hear her calling silently, back to me.

Fall Garden Reminders:

- ~ Allow healthy plants to naturally mulch down if possible
- ~ Dig up and throw in the garbage, unhealthy diseased plants
- ~ Pull weeds carefully, to not disturb nearby wanted plant roots
- ~ Pick up sticks and limbs that can become a tripping hazard once the leaves fall
- ~ Like a certain flower spot? Note it down! Dislike a certain flower spot? Pull it up!
- ~ Replace, align, and/or fix any fencing and plant support
- ~ Do any plants need to be moved? Make note and plan now
- ~ Any trees or bushes need to be trimmed from the house? Take note to have it done during winter dormant months
- ~ Was/is there an abundance of mosquitos? Seek out and dump any standing water and/or alter areas that hold water
- ~ Seed collection time is upon us. Use paper envelopes or paper bags and clearly mark what you are putting in the bag (flower name, color, size, best place to plant it).
- ~ Mark plants in the ground that need to be divided in winter, and where we want to place them, so we do not forget to do so
- ~ We live in Georgia: check for ticks often
- ~ Regardless of cooler weather, stay hydrated and take breaks

Juniors: Preschool through age 7; Intermediates: ages 8 through 12;
and High School: ages 13 through 18.

2.. Youth Exhibits are evaluated using the Photography Scale of points, the Design Scale of Points and the Artistic Crafts Scale of Points.

3. Entry card must state the age of each exhibitor with their entry.

4. Eligible for Youth Top Exhibitor Award in each age category of each of the three Sections.

GNF Awards for Section A, B & C: 1st (\$15) 2nd (\$10) 3rd (\$8) HM (\$6)

*** Premium checks for the Youth Division will be mailed from the Standard Flower Show Committee**

SECTION A Botanical Arts: Photography “Picture the Future”

Photograph of flowers, insects or landscapes (cannot include people or animals). Photograph should be mounted on a sheet of black cardstock, no larger than 9” X 12”. No frame allowed. To be displayed on a cream-colored wall. Judged by the Photography Scale of Points. (Revised Hb, 2017-2022, 2nd Edition, Pp 95-96; Scale of Points Pg 131)

Class 1 “Flower Stars” Age preschool – 7 years Photograph of Flowers

Class 2 “Critters at Work” Age 8-12 years Photograph of pollinators”

Class 3 “This Land Is My Land” Age 13-18 years Photograph of ornamental or vegetable gardens.

SECTION B Botanical Arts: Artistic Crafts “Saluting Our Heritage”

Exhibit staged in a space approximately 15” x 15” on a table 8’ wide X 30” high X 30” deep, top covered in white and skirted in green, furnished by the show committee. No artificial plant material may be used. Judged by the Artistic Crafts Scale of Points (Revised Hb 2017-2025, 2nd Edition, Pp 94-95, Artistic Crafts Scale of Points Pg 131)

Class 4 “The Liberty Bell” Age preschool—7 years Decorate a hand-held bell.

Class 5 “The Boston Tea Party” Age 8-12 years Decorate a tea cup and saucer.

Class 6 “A Fourth of July Picnic” Age 13-18 years Decorate a basket of designer’s choosing for a picnic. The Basket may be no larger than 8”x10”

SECTION C Botanical Arts: Design “Just My Size”

An Exploration (free-style) design made using a drink cup from a fast-food store/restaurant and fresh or dried plant material. No artificial plants may be used. Each exhibit staged in a space approximately 12” square on a stairstep fixture, 42” high x 48” wide, with each step 12” deep and 12” high, furnished by the Show Committee. Judged by the Design Scale of Points (Revised Hb, 2017-2025, 2nd Edition, Pp 130)

Class 7 “A Small Appetite” Age preschool – 7 years Using a small cup no taller than 6 inches

Class 8 “A Large Appetite” Age 8 – 12 years Using a medium cup no taller than 8 inches

Class 9 “A Voracious Appetite” Age 13 - 18 years Using a large cup no taller than 10 inches
